- 31 confirmed COVID-19 cases | 1 death | 18 recovered

Inyo County Testing:

- Total Tests Administered: 1187 (NIHD, SIH, & Toiyabe)
- Tests Positive: 31
- Tests Negative: 1125
- Tests Pending*: 31
**Cases with pending results are monitored by medical staff ordering test; Inyo County Public Health monitors pending results identified as high probability individuals.*

Local Information, Action, & Recommendations

- **GOVERNOR'S ORDER – BARS TO SHUT DOWN IN THE COUNTIES WHO DO NOT MEET METRICS:** As part of the State's efforts to address COVID-19, the State monitors county specific data and provides technical assistance, support and interventions to counties that have concerning levels of disease transmission, hospitalizations, or insufficient testing. To reduce disease transmission and to protect residents across the state, one strategy available to the state is to work with counties to reverse some or all of the sector openings currently allowed under the State order. Should Inyo County exceed the reopening metrics proposed to the State in May and continue to do so for three days, all bars will be immediately closed. For more information visit:

- **Face Coverings:** Wearing a face covering when outside of your home and when in the company of non-household members continues to remain a vital tool in decreasing the spread of COVID-19. - **4th of July Reminder:** At this time gatherings of any size with individuals outside of your household are not permissible under California's Stay at Home Order. All picnics and barbecues are to include only household members and should take place at home or close to home. The fireworks shows in Bishop and Independence for 2020 will be modified to be "Stay at Home Shows." This means that no central viewing areas will be provided or available. Instead the public is encouraged to enjoy the 2020 fireworks shows with household members from their yards.
- **Verily Testing Holiday Schedule:** Due to the 4th of July holiday, Lone Pine's Friday testing will be rescheduled to take place on Thursday, July 3rd and Bishop's Thursday testing will be cancelled.
