County of Inyo Board of Supervisors

December 15, 2015

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Inyo, State of California, met in regular session at the hour of 8:45 a.m., on Tuesday, December 15, 2015, in the Board of Supervisors Room, County Administrative Center, Independence, with the following Supervisors present: Chairperson Matt Kingsley, presiding, Dan Totheroh, Rick Pucci, Jeff Griffiths, and Mark Tillemans.

- Public Comment The Chairperson announced the public comment period and there was no one wishing to address the Board.
- Post Agenda/
Closed Session County Counsel requested the Board consider adding a post agenda item for closed session. She said that in the matter entitled **CONFERENCE WITH LEGAL COUNSEL – EXISTING LITIGATION (Pursuant to Government Code §54956.9(d)(1) – Native American Heritage Commission vs. Inyo County Planning Department and Inyo County Board of Supervisors, Inyo County Superior Court Case No. SICVPT 1557557 (Munro Petition for Writ of Mandate)**, a settlement conference had taken place and there was a need to report the results of that conference. She went on to say that there is a need for the Board to provide direction regarding this litigation prior to the Board's next regularly scheduled meeting. The Assistant Clerk of the Board explained that in order to meet the requirements to add a post agenda, the matter had to of arisen after the Agenda for today's meeting was published and there is a need for a decision to be made prior to the next regularly scheduled Board Meeting. Moved by Supervisor Griffiths and seconded by Supervisor Totheroh to find that the need to address a closed session item concerning existing litigation with the Native American Heritage Commission, arose after the agenda for today's meeting was published and there is a need for the Board to address this item prior to the next regularly scheduled Board Meeting, therefore this item is added as Agenda Item 5A. Motion carried unanimously.

- Recess/
Reconvene The Chairperson recessed closed session at 10:00 a.m., to reconvene in open session at 10:05 a.m., with all Board Members present.
- Pledge Supervisor Rick Pucci led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Public Comment	The Chairperson announced the second public comment period. Mike Patterson, Program Director for Sierra Life Flight, updated the Board on their current situation in south County. He said that the Emergency Room at the Southern Inyo Hospital had been closed and he had sent one of their teams down to Lone Pine to help provide critical care for the area. He said that as a result of this he had contacted ICEMA who informed him that he did not have authority to operate a fixed wing aircraft out of the Lone Pine Airport. He went on to ask the Board to support their efforts in south County and to request ICEMA to allow their temporary operations in Lone Pine to continue. Ms. Shannon Williams, Olancha Resident, addressed the Board to personally thank Sierra Life Flight and their crew for the help they have extended to the residents of south County, explaining how important some type of critical care is to that part of the County now that Southern Inyo Hospital is no longer providing it. Earl Wilson, Lone Pine Resident, also thanked Sierra Life Flight for their help.
Department Report Period	Because the Board was precluded from discussing the public comment report, the Chairperson said he was going to open the Department Report period and asked for an update on the Southern Inyo Hospital closure from effected Departments. Josh Hart, Planning Director, provided the Board with the schedule for upcoming public meetings on the Owens Valley Solar Energy Study. Marilyn Mann, Assistant HHS Director, explained that she was unable to respond to the Southern Inyo Hospital situation, but that she would take any questions and get back with the answers. Supervisor Kingsley provided information on the situation at the Hospital and said that he, along with the County Administrator, the Fire Department, and other concerned citizen's, are working to get the issue with ICEMA resolved.
Public Comment	As a result of a request from an audience member, the Chairperson reopened the Public Comment period. Mr. Philip Anaya, Bishop Area Resident, addressed the Owens Valley Solar Energy Study, saying he had attended the workshop in Bishop and the reaction he had to the process is that while it is a comprehensive evaluation of the resources in the Valley, he believes it is lacking specific identification of places that are degraded that could serve as locations for the project.
CAO-Personnel/ Schneider Contract	Moved by Supervisor Tillemans and seconded by Supervisor Griffiths to approve the Contract between the County of Inyo and Dr. Jeanette Schneider, for personal services as the County Psychiatrist, at the rate of \$13,164 per month; and authorize the County Administrator to sign. Motion carried unanimously.
Coroner/Coroner Services Contract Amendments	Moved by Supervisor Tillemans and seconded by Supervisor Griffiths to approve the Amendments to the Contracts between the County of Inyo and the following for Coroner services; and authorize the Chairperson to sign, contingent upon the appropriate signatures being obtained: A) Amendment No. 1 to the Contract with Central Valley Toxicology, Inc., for toxicology services, extending the term of the Contract to June 30, 2016; B) Amendment No. 1 to the Contract with William D. DA/Victim Witness Grant	Moved by Supervisor Tillemans and seconded by Supervisor Griffiths to authorize the acceptance of the Inyo County Victim/Witness Assistance Program (VW15 24 140) Grant from the Governor's Office of Emergency Services for FY 2016-2016; and authorize the District Attorney to sign any documentation to accept and utilize the grant on behalf of the County. Motion carried unanimously.
Planning/Munro Valley Renewable Energy Permit Amendment	Moved by Supervisor Tillemans and seconded by Supervisor Griffiths to approve Amendment No. 2 to the Renewable Energy Permit 2013-01 for Munro Valley Solar, replacing the original Exhibit A site plan with the substitute which incorporates the increased project setback from Highway 395 as requested by the Board of Supervisors as a condition of project approval. Motion carried unanimously.

Resol. 2015-64/ Window Replacement Project	On a motion by Supervisor Tillemans and a second by Supervisor Griffiths, Resolution No. 2015-64 was approved, accepting the improvements and authorizing the recording of a Notice of Completion for the County Services Building Window Replacement Project: motion unanimously passed and adopted.
P.W./2015 Inyo County Standard Specs and ISL Contract Amendment	Moved by Supervisor Tillemans and seconded by Supervisor Griffiths to A) approve and adopt the new 2015 Inyo County Standard Specifications and Standard Details for use on all Inyo County Public Works projects as well as Inyo County Road Department projects and permits; and B) approve Amendment No. 5 to the Agreement between the County of Inyo and ISL Engineering, Inc., extending the ending date of the Contract one year to December 31, 2016. Motion carried unanimously.
BofS/ESCOG Agenda Items and Support Letter	Supervisor Griffiths, a Board appointment to the ESCOG, explained that he wants to change the ESCOG Agenda process a bit to resemble the County of Inyo's Standing Committee process. He said he is bringing the ESCOG Agenda for the upcoming December 18, 2015 to the Board for direction on how the Inyo County Board of Supervisors would like its delegates to the ESCOG to proceed on any given agenda item. Mr. Griffiths went on to talk with the Board about the Agenda items including the proposed local government workshop which he estimated would cost each of the member agencies \$1,000 and the regional collaboration on broadband. The County Administrator provided further information regarding the local broadband consortium and suggested that the consortium be defunded and the funding moved to the ESCOG. The Board went on to discuss the goals for the ESCOG addressed in the letter of support. Moved by Supervisor Pucci and seconded by Supervisor Tillemans to support ESCOG conducting a local government workshop for its members with the equal distribution of the costs between member counties; and approve the letter supporting the outlined ESCOG goals for 2016; and authorize the Chairperson to sign. Motion carried unanimously.
HHS-ESAAA/Reg. Dietitian Mono County Services Contract	Moved by Supervisor Griffiths and seconded by Supervisor Totheroh to ratify and approve a Contract between the County of Inyo and the County of Mono for the ESAAA's Registered Dietitian (RD) to provide the mandated RD services for menu and nutrition services to Mono County seniors, in an amount not to exceed \$20,000; and authorize the HHS/ESAAA Director to sign; and transmit a signed copy to the Clerk of the Board for the Board's files. Motion carried unanimously.
Sheriff/Budget Amendment and Tyler Tech Contract	Moved by Supervisor Tillemans and seconded by Supervisor Griffiths to A) amend the FY 2015-2016 Sheriff General Budget Unit 022700 by increasing estimated revenue in Civil Process Service Fees (<i>Revenue Code \$4699</i>) by \$9,975 and increasing appropriations in Equipment (<i>Object Code #5650</i>) by \$9,975; and B) declare Tyler Technologies, Inc., a sole-source provider of Civil Service software program services and approve the purchase of Civil Service software program update including training and project management plan per quote 6162015-V4 Upgrade in an amount not to exceed \$9,975. Motion carried unanimously.
P.W./Tecopa HVAC Replacement Prjct. Plans and Specs and Contract	The Deputy Public Works Director, Shannon Williams, provided additional information and further justification for the request to approve the Tecopa Community Center HVAC Replacement Project. Moved by Supervisor Griffiths and seconded by Supervisor Totheroh to A) approve the Plans and Specifications for the Tecopa Community Center HVAC Replacement Project and authorize the Public Works Director to advertise and bid the Project; B) authorize the Public Works Director to award and approve the Contract for the project if the bids received are within the Project budget; to sign the Contract, contingent upon the appropriate signatures being obtained and transmit a signed copy to the Clerk of the Board for the Board's files; and C) authorize the Public Works Director to sign all other Contract documents, including change orders, to the extent permitted pursuant to Section 20142 of the Public Contract Code and other applicable law. Motion carried unanimously.
P.W./Baker Contract for Multi-Jurisdiction Hazard Mitigation Plan	The Public Works Director, Clint Quilter, provided additional information on the Michael Baker professional services contract. He said that funding for this contract to create a Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan is coming for CalOES who has been working with the County to get this Plan completed because we are the only ones in the State that does not have this type of Plan. Moved by Supervisor Pucci and seconded by Supervisor Totheroh to approve the Contract between the County of Inyo and Michael Baker International for professional services to create a Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan, for the period of December 15, 2015 through December 2, 2016, in an amount not to exceed \$98,499, contingent upon the Board's adoption of future budgets; and authorize the Chairperson to sign, contingent upon the appropriate signatures being obtained. Motion carried unanimously.

Planning/Assoc. Planner Position Request	Moved by Supervisor Totheroh and seconded by Supervisor Pucci to find that consistent with the Authorized Position Review Policy: A) the availability of funding for an Associate Planner position exists in the Planning Department budget, as certified by the Planning Director and concurred with by the County Administrator and Auditor-Controller; B) where internal candidates meet the qualification of the position, the vacancy could possibly be filled through an internal recruitment, however an open recruitment is more appropriate; and C) approve the hiring of one Associate Planner at Range 74 (\$4,731 - \$5,750). Motion carried unanimously.
Planning/Forest Plan Revision Update	The Planning Director, Josh Hart, updated the Board about coordination with Forest Service staff regarding the Inyo National Forest Plan Update/Revision since the last update. He said that there has not been much movement on this since then. He said the first document on the Wilderness has been released and said that once staff has had an opportunity to analyze it, a report would be forthcoming in the future for the Board.
Parks/Bishop Waste Contracts Amendments	Moved by Supervisor Griffiths and seconded by Supervisor Pucci to ratify and approve Amendments No. 1 to the two Contracts between the County of Inyo and Bishop Waste Disposal for waste hauling services at County parks and campgrounds, extending the ending date of the Contracts to March 30, 2016; and increasing Contract limits for North County services by \$5,281 to a total amount not to exceed \$67,356, and South County services by \$1,580 to a total amount not to exceed \$20,356; and authorize the Chairperson to sign. Motion carried unanimously.
Integ. Waste/ Preferred Septic Contracts Amendments	Moved by Supervisor Totheroh and seconded by Supervisor Tillemans to ratify and approve the Amendments No. 1 to the two Contracts between the County of Inyo and Preferred Septic and Disposal for waste hauling services at the Darwin and Keeler and Olancha, Transfer Stations, extending the ending date of the Contracts to June 30, 2016; and increasing Contract limits for Darwin Contract by \$5,861 to a total amount not to exceed \$36,003.90; for Keeler and Olancha Contract by \$16,790.20 to a total amount not to exceed \$103,190.80; and authorize the Chairperson to sign, contingent upon the appropriate signatures being obtained. Motion carried unanimously.
CAO/Sesquicentennial Celebration	The County Administrator announced that the County of Inyo's Sesquicentennial (150 th Anniversary) is coming up on March 22, 2016. He said that he has formed a committee to explore options and coordinate community activities related to the Anniversary. He said the Board has scheduled a Meeting on Tuesday, March 22, 2016, to kick-off the celebration, which he said he envisions to be similar to the Nations 200 th anniversary, but on a much smaller scale, with groups and organizations planning Anniversary celebrations within the context of their organizations' activities.
Emerg. Serv./D.V. Roadeater Emergency	Moved by Supervisor Tillemans and seconded by Supervisor Totheroh to continue the local emergency, The Death Valley Roadeater Emergency that resulted in flooding in the eastern portion of Inyo County during the month of August 2012, per Resolution #2012-32, as recommended by the County Administrator. Motion carried unanimously.
Emerg. Serv./Gully Washer Emergency	Moved by Supervisor Griffiths and seconded by Supervisor Tillemans to continue the local emergency, The Gully Washer Emergency that resulted in flooding in the central, south and southeastern portion of Inyo County during the month of July, 2013, as recommended by the County Administrator. Motion carried unanimously.
Emerg. Serv./Canyon Crusher Emergency	Moved by Supervisor Tillemans and seconded by Supervisor Pucci to continue the local emergency, The Canyon Crusher Emergency, that resulted in flooding in the portions of Inyo County during the month of August, 2013, was recommended by the County Administrator. Motion carried unanimously.
Emerg. Serv./Land of Even Less Water Emergency	Moved by Supervisor Totheroh and seconded by Supervisor Pucci to continue the local emergency, known as the "Land of EVEN Less Water Emergency" that was proclaimed as a result of extreme drought conditions that exist in the County as recommended by the County Administrator. Motion carried unanimously.
Emerg. Serv./D.V. Down But Not Out Emergency	Kelley Williams in the CAO's office reported on a tour of Scotty's Castle to view the storm damage. Moved by Supervisor Tillemans and seconded by Supervisor Pucci to continue the local emergency, known as the "Death Valley Down But Not Out Emergency" that was proclaimed as a result of flooding in the central, south and southeastern portion of Inyo County during the month of October, 2015. Motion carried unanimously.

BofS/Minute Approval Moved by Supervisor Tillemans and seconded by Supervisor Griffiths to approve the minutes of the November 24, 2015 Board of Supervisors Meeting. Motion carried unanimously.

Recess/Reconvene The Chairperson recessed the regular meeting at 11:00 a.m., to reconvene at 11:38 a.m., with all Board Members present.

P.W./ATV Adventure Trails System Pilot Project Public Hearing For Legislative Report The Chairperson opened the public hearing at 11:38 a.m. to take public comment on the Eastern Sierra ATV Adventure Trails System Pilot Project; Mr. Courtney Smith, Senior Transportation Planner, presented the Eastern Sierra Adventure Trails Combined Use Pilot Project Report to the California Legislature as required by AB 628 and summarized the report.

The Chairperson asked for public comment on the Project.

Mike Johnston, President of the Eastern Sierra 4WD Club, supported the project and said that the OHV organizations support access and staying on designated routes. He emphasized how important education is to the Project and said that the various OHV groups are doing their part to educate users.

Earl Wilson, Lone Pine Resident, stated that he believes signage is required to more clearly mark the end of the combined-use routes. He would like to see a sign that reads: "No ATV use beyond this point." He said that currently there is a plastic stake on the ground to denote the location. He lodged complaints regarding two illegal uses of non-street legal vehicles. One was an ATV driving with spotlights at 9:00 p.m. on Horseshoe Meadows Road on the curve before Carroll Creek and the second was a sand rail traveling at a high rate of speed on Movie Flats Road. The Chairperson clarified that while the activity he cited was illegal, the incidents had not occurred on the Pilot Project ATV approved routes.

Philip Anaya of Bishop said that he believes that ATVs tend to abuse their privilege of access. He went on to say that marketing for these vehicles emphasizes the conquest of nature and that few OHVs don't speed. He stated he believes the County is taking on a large liability risk through Section 38026.1(d)(1) of the Vehicle Code and that this burden goes to all taxpayers in Inyo County. (It was clarified later in the discussion that insurance is required.)

Doug Brown, Bishop Area Resident, said that he fully supports the Project. He said that his family operates businesses on leased City of Los Angeles Department of Water and Power (LADWP) land. He said that two of the businesses are at the start points of two approved combined-use routes that have not been opened because of access issues with LADWP and he would like to see these routes opened as soon as possible. He went on to report that he hasn't heard of any ill effects created by the project so far.

Glen Clark of Bishop thanked the Supervisors for their support of the Project, saying this is a great program for the County. He went on to say that the County needs this program and it will provide many benefits to our County.

Steve Toomey said that the project is great, though it is too fragmented and he thought the Project would be more effective if it provided greater coverage.

Randy Gillespie, of the Eastern Sierra Adventure Trails System, LLC., stated that the Project has gone smoothly so far. He said he felt the only negative is that more routes haven't been designated. He suggested that if additional data is needed, the State should look to similar projects in Utah that have been on the ground for more than ten years.

Supervisor Jeff Griffiths took the opportunity to clarify, in answer to Mr. Anaya's comments regarding insurance liability, that insurance is required by users of the combined-use routes per the Vehicle Code.

Supervisor Mark Tillemans said everyone is concerned with the environment and this Project highlights the difference between managed vs. unmanaged. He went on to say education is key to making this Program successful in protecting the environment. He noted that the program is already in place, and the legislation extended the allowable limit for combined-use from 3 to 10 miles to suit our rural setting in order to better maximize environmental protections offered by a managed route system.

Supervisor Rick Pucci supported moving forward to expand the Program, saying the only complaint he has heard is that there are not enough routes. He noted that the Project was whittled down to 7 routes and it is a shame the County has only been able to open three routes. He also noted that the use of the County combined-use roads by OHVs is only allowed during daylight hours.

Supervisor Dan Totheroh concurred that he hasn't heard any negative comments on the combined-use routes; but has heard negative comments about OHVs from areas where there are not combined-use routes.

Supervisor Jeff Griffiths agreed that he also has not heard negative comments about the designated routes, and now it is time to see what happens with the State regarding the amount of data that is available by submitting the report.

Supervisor Totheroh had heard a complaint that it was difficult to find and utilize the Monitoring and Reporting web page and asked staff to look into this complaint.

Supervisor Tillemans said the County had reached consensus out of controversy on this project and the County should pursue the necessary steps to open routes that link to U.S. Forest Service land.

The Chairperson, Supervisor Matt Kingsley, said he would like to see comments on the Program split between those that are specifically about the combined-use routes and those that are not applicable. He said he felt LADWP has hampered the feasibility of the Report by not providing the County with the access to open four of the approved routes. He said he supported having the County request a three year extension and noted that there are other California counties that would support our request to extend the pilot project so more data can be gathered, because they are interested in this type of project for their County. He said he doesn't believe there is enough data in the report for the Legislature to enact the Legislation into law.

Supervisor Pucci said that while he was traveling on one of the approved routes on an OHV there was a parked car that appeared to be taking notes. He said he must have been using the route appropriately because he has not heard any complaints.

Earl Wilson clarified his earlier comments saying he would like to see signs that read 1) this is the end of the Approved ATV Route, No ATVs Beyond This Point, and 2) This is the Turn-in to the combined-use route.

Supervisor Tillemans noted that he supports the revisions to the Report and to the cover letter that were made since the last meeting that stated there hasn't been enough time to gather information.

The Chairperson closed the public hearing at 12:15 p.m.,

Moved by Supervisor Rick Pucci and seconded by Supervisor Tillemans to approve the Report to the California Legislature summarizing the Assembly Bill 628 Pilot Project and authorize staff to submit. Motion carried unanimously.

Closed Session The Chairperson recessed the regular meeting at 12:15 p.m. to reconvene in closed session at 1:00 p.m., with all Board Members present, to discuss and take action as appropriate on previously identified closed session items. The Chairperson recessed closed session at 1:30 p.m., to reconvene in a workshop, at 1:40 p.m., with all Board Members present.

Planning/Draft Tribal Consultation Policy Workshop The Board convened in the third workshop regarding the Draft Tribal Consultation Policy. The Chairperson recessed the workshop at 2:40 p.m., to reconvene in open session, with all Board Members present.

County Department Reports The Board heard from the following departments who presented a year-in-review for their Departments: Farm Advisor, Dustin Blakely; Auditor-Controller, Amy Shepherd; Sheriff Bill Lutze; Assistant Health and Human Services Director, Marilyn Mann; Child Support Services Director, Susanne Rizo; Agricultural Commissioner, Nate Reade; Environmental Health Director, Marvin Moskowitz; Clerk-Recorder, Kammi Foote; Planning Director, Josh Hart; Public Works Director, Clint Quilter; Water Director, Dr. Bob Harrington; Assessor, Dave Stottlemyre; County Counsel, Marge Kemp-Williams; the Chief Probation Officer, Jeff Thomson, submitted a written report which was recapped by the County Administrator; and the County Administrative Officer, Kevin Carunchio.

Report on Closed Session	County Counsel reported the following with regard to closed session items: No. 2, no reportable action; Nos. 3 and 4, withdrawn; No. 5, instructions were given to negotiators and staff; No. 5A, instructions were given to Counsel.
Public Comment	The Chairperson announced the final public comment period. Mr. Earl Wilson, Lone Pine Resident, addressed the Board to offer his kudos to the Board for being responsive to the public.
Recess/ Reconvene	The Chairperson recessed the regular meeting at 4:05 p.m., to reconvene in open session at 4:13 p.m., with all Board Members present.
CAO-Personnel County Offices Holiday Door Decorating Contest	The County Administrator provided additional information concerning this year's Inyo County Offices Holiday Door Decorating contest, commending Kelley Williams of his staff for her efforts on this event. The Chairperson announced that the Health and Human Services Department, Social Services Division was this year's winner and presented Marilyn Mann, Assistant Health and Human Services Director, with the prize. The Chairperson went on to present the winner of this year's Charlie Brown award to the Assessor's Office.
Board Members and Staff Reports	Supervisor Pucci, requested that today's meeting be adjourned in the memory of Bob Tonner, who recently passed away. The Board Members congratulated the County Administrator on his marriage and wished everyone happy holidays.
