- CRITICAL REMINDER Failure to Comply with Health Officer Orders: While the Health
 Officer encourages voluntary compliance with all orders and recommendations, additional
 actions may be taken by the Health Officer, which may include civil detention or requiring
 one to stay at a health facility or other location, to protect the public's health if an individual
 who is subject to a Health Order violates or fails to comply with Health Officer orders.
 Violation of Health Officer Orders may also result in a misdemeanor punishable by
 imprisonment, fine, or both (Health and Safety Code §120295). Current Orders issued by the
