- Tests Administered: 119 (NIHD & Toiyabe)

 *Cases with pending results are monitored by medical staff ordering test; Inyo County Public Health monitors pending results identified as high probability individuals.

You will be matched to the appropriate agency based on the type of assistance requested. CRITICAL REMINDER - Failure to comply with Health Officer Orders places individuals and our community at increased risk of infection. Violation of Health Officer Orders may also result in a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment, fine, or both (Health and Safety Code §120295). Additional actions may be taken by the Health Officer, including civil detention or requiring one to stay at a health facility or other location, to protect the public's health if an individual who is subject to a Health Order violates or fails to comply with Health Officer orders. The best enforcement tool we have is social pressure, so if you see inappropriate behavior, say something! - CDPH Face Coverings Guidance: Cloth face coverings are NOT A SUBSTITUTE for physical distancing and washing hands and staying home when ill, but they may be helpful when combined with these primary interventions by reducing asymptomatic transmission. It's a good idea to wash your cloth face covering frequently, ideally after each use, or at least daily. Have a bag or bin to keep cloth face coverings in until they can be laundered with detergent and hot water and dried on a hot cycle. Discard cloth face coverings that: no longer cover the nose and mouth, have stretched out or damaged ties or straps, cannot stay on the face, or have holes or tears in the fabric. - Help for Small Businesses & Workers Displaced by COVID-19: Beginning April 3rd on a first-come, first-served basis California small businesses impacted by the COVID-19 crisis can apply for a loan from the federal government for up to \$10 million. The Governor also announced that the state is allocating \$50 million to the California Infrastructure and Economic Development Bank for loan guarantees to small businesses to help eliminate barriers to capital for individuals who do not qualify for federal funds. Additionally, Governor Newsom announced \$17.8 million in new state initiatives to support California workers impacted by COVID-19. For more information visit:

- Protection from Water Shutoffs Executive Order: Governor Gavin Newsom signed an executive order on April 2nd that will restrict water shutoffs to homes and small businesses while the state responds to the COVID-19 pandemic.
