- Inyo County 18th Positive: Inyo County's Public Health Officer, Dr. James Richardson, received notification this afternoon from Northern Inyo Healthcare District regarding one new positive COVID-19 case for an Inyo County resident. Inyo County Public Health is working to determine the source of the infection, and is conducting investigations to identify potential exposures and notify contacts. For more information visit:

- Inyo County asks CDFW for Fishing Opener Postponement: On Wednesday April 15,
 California Fish and Game commission granted authority to the Director of Fish and Wildlife to take emergency actions related to the fishing opener in the Eastern Sierra Region. Inyo

County Unified Command fully anticipates that authority will be approved by the Administrative Office of Law and the Secretary of State early next week. In anticipation of that approval, the County of Inyo expects the fishing opener will be postponed until the Governor rescinds his executive order barring non-essential travel and the Stay at Home Order. - **COVID-19 Prevention** Remember that you can help reduce the spread of COVID-19 by staying home as much as possible, washing your hands frequently, by practicing social distancing, and using a cloth face covering when in public.
- CRITICAL REMINDER Failure to comply with Health Officer Orders places individuals and our community at increased risk of infection. Violation of Health Officer Orders may also result in a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment, fine, or both (Health and Safety Code §120295). Additional actions may be taken by the Health Officer, including civil detention or requiring one to stay at a health facility or other location, to protect the public's health if an individual who is subject to a Health Order violates or fails to comply with Health Officer orders. The best enforcement tool we have is social pressure, so if you see inappropriate behavior, say something! - Executive Order on Actions in Response to COVID-19: Governor Gavin Newsom today signed an executive order addressing a variety of issues in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, including adjusting admissions requirements for the California State University

system, providing flexibility for 60 days on background checks for critical infrastructure sectors, federal stimulus checks to flow directly to custodial parents owed back child support payments and will additionally allow for commercially licensed food trucks to be able to temporarily operate in roadside rest areas for a period of 60 days.
