Local Information, Action, & Recommendations

- Inyo County Special Board of Supervisors Meeting Accelerated Stage 2: The Inyo County Board of Supervisors scheduled a special meeting regarding the reopening of Inyo County for Friday, May 15, 2020. Health & Human Services is scheduled to request that the Board consider the metrics to attest that Inyo County meets the State of California's readiness criteria to move through the Second Stage of Reopening at its own pace. Inyo County residents should note that if two confirmed cases occur prior to approval by CDPH it may result in our variance not being approved.
- CRITICAL REMINDER Failure to comply with Health Officer Orders places individuals and our community at increased risk of infection. Violation of Health Officer Orders may also result in a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment, fine, or both (Health and Safety Code §120295).
