- **The Tri-County Fair Needs Your Help:** The California Fair Industry needs your help, including the Tri-County Fairgrounds. The industry is facing bankruptcy, with many California Fairgrounds preparing for complete closure as early as this month due to COVID 19. Mass gatherings are currently the last phase of the re-opening plan for California, which is forecasted to be months away. This means ZERO revenue opportunities for fairgrounds. The fairgrounds are self-sufficient by generating funds through various events which is not possible at this time. The Tri-County Fairgrounds is working with a Network of California Fairs on a grassroots campaign to make their case to the Legislature for essential emergency funding.
