INYO COUNTY HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT
PUBLIC HEALTH OFFICER RESCISSION OF CERTAIN ORDERS:

TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF NON-ESSENTIAL PUBLIC GATHERINGS
REQUIRED SOCIAL DISTANCING MEASURES
CLOSURE AND LIMITATIONS OF CERTAIN BUSINESSES
ISSUED ON MARCH 20, 2020

AND

APPLICABLE TO BUSINESSES OPERATING DURING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC
ISSUED ON MARCH 31, 2020

WHEREAS, the Governor and State Department of Public Health have identified key metrics to allow for modification of the Governor's Stay-At-Home executive orders issued in response to the COVID-19 pandemic; and

WHEREAS, the Governor has issued a Pandemic Resilience Roadmap outlining four stages for reopening the State of California and modification of Executive Orders; and

WHEREAS, the Governor recently declared his intent to modify his Stay-At-Home order and allow certain identified lower risk non-essential business to reopen with identified modifications; and

WHEREAS, based on current pandemic metrics, the Inyo County Health Officer has decided to rescind certain previously issued local health orders because they either duplicate or could be construed as imposing greater restrictions than those imposed by current state orders, which are not warranted by health conditions in Inyo County at this time.


NOW, THEREFORE, THE HEALTH OFFICER OF THE COUNTY OF INYO (“HEALTH OFFICER”) RESCINDS as follows:

1. Public Health Officer Order Issued March 20, 2020 for Temporary Prohibition of Non-Essential Public Gatherings, Required Social Distancing Measures, and Closure and Limitations of Certain Businesses

AND

2. Public Health Officer Order Issued March 31, 2020 Applicable To Businesses Operating During the COVID-19 Pandemic

Note: notwithstanding the rescission of these local orders, many of their provisions remain in effect statewide pursuant to the Governor’s current executive orders and guidance. The public is advised to review those orders and to contact state or local health departments with any questions.
