Inyo County Cases:

- 20 confirmed COVID-19 cases | 1 death | 18 recovered

Inyo County Testing:

Due to unforeseen circumstances the testing numbers are not current for June 1, 2020

- Total Tests Administered: 608 (NIHD, SIH, & Toiyabe)
- Tests Positive: 20
- Tests Negative: 574
- Tests Pending*: 14

**Cases with pending results are monitored by medical staff ordering test; Inyo County Public Health monitors pending results identified as high probability individuals.*

- **Executive Order on Actions in Response to COVID-19:** Governor Gavin Newsom issued an executive order on May 29th extending authorization for local governments to halt evictions for renters impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic, through July 28. The order also addresses a variety of issues in response to the pandemic, by extending the waiver permitting the Department of Motor Vehicles to allow for mail-in renewals of driver's licenses and identification cards, and waiving certain programmatic and administrative requirements that restrict child care and afterschool programs from serving children of essential infrastructure workers.
