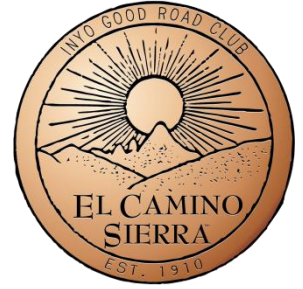

Inyo County Cases:

- 20 confirmed COVID-19 cases | 1 death | 18 recovered

Inyo County Testing:

- Total Tests Administered: 731 (NIHD, SIH, & Toiyabe)
- Tests Positive: 20
- Tests Negative: 674
- Tests Pending*: 37
**Cases with pending results are monitored by medical staff ordering test; Inyo County Public Health monitors pending results identified as high probability individuals.*

Local Information, Action, & Recommendations

- **Inyo County Re-Opening Stage 3:** The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) has announced that new guidance is available for additional industries that will be allowed to reopen in Stage 3 of California's Resilience Roadmap. Some of the industry guidance is applicable state-wide, other industry guidance is only applicable for counties who applied for and successfully received a variance to the Roadmap. Inyo County received its variance on May 15, 2020.

The additional industries that received guidance today include:

- State-wide:
 - Schools
 - Daycamps
 - Revisions to previously-issued daycare guidance
 - Film, music, and television production
 - Tribal casinos and gambling
- Variance Counties:
 - Short term lodging
 - Campgrounds
 - Bars and wineries
 - Gyms and fitness studios (includes pools)
 - Family entertainment centers
 - Zoos
 - Museums
