### Local Information, Action, & Recommendations

- **Inyo County Flu Vaccination Clinics:** The Inyo County Department of Health and Human Services, Public Health and Prevention division continues to host drive through flu vaccination clinics. This Sunday, October 4th, the clinic will be held at the Big Pine School, 500 S Main Street. Please ensure that you comply with the following safety guidance:

- Patients must remain in their vehicles
- Children must remain restrained in car seats
- Vehicle occupants must wear face covering or shield
- Dogs or other animals should not accompany the patient

Additional clinics will be held in Independence, Lone Pine, Olancho, Tecopa, and Furnace Creek, details to be released once locations are finalized.

This is a no cost clinic and appointments are **not** necessary. For more information or questions please contact Public Health at 760-873-7868.

- **Verily – Bishop Site:** The Verily community-based COVID-19 testing site has returned to its original location at the Nazarene Church, 900 W Line St, Bishop. To schedule a test in Bishop, visit [www.projectbaseline.com](http://www.projectbaseline.com) and select the site named Bishop. We received notification that there were issues registering for an appointment in Bishop today, the issue has since been remedied. Please note that the testing site is subject to closure if air quality is hazardous.
