- California Public Health Officials Release Guidance & Updates to State's Blueprint for a Safe Economy: On October 20th the California Department of Public Health issued new guidance for amusement and theme parks, movie theaters, and performances and made updates to the Blueprint for a Safer Economy. The Blueprint for a Safer Economy now allows all personal care services to operate indoors with modifications in tier 1 (widespread/ purple). - Inyo County Flu Vaccination Clinics: The Inyo County Department of Health and Human Services, Public Health and Prevention division continues to host drive through flu vaccination clinics. The next clinic is scheduled for this Sunday, November 1st from 10am to 2pm in Bishop. The clinic will be held at the Bishop Senior Center, 682 Spruce St, as a drive through site unless weather or smoke prohibits; in which case it will be held as a walk-up/walk-in site indoors at the same location. Please ensure that you comply with the following drive-up safety guidance:
 - o Patients must remain in their vehicles
 - o Children must remain restrained in car seats
 - Vehicle occupants must wear face covering or shield with drape at all times
 - Dogs or other animals should not accompany the patient

And the following walk-in guidance:

- Patients must maintain at least 6 foot distance from each other while waiting
- o Patients must wear face covering or shield with drape at all times

Additional clinics will be held in Lone Pine, Olancha, Tecopa, Shoshone, and Furnace Creek.
