- COVID-19 Vaccination Registration: Inyo County Public Health and Northern Inyo Healthcare District have combined their vaccination registration processes to create a single point for registration for all Inyo County residents. Everyone seeking a vaccine who has not already registered, should register on the Vaccine Registration site https://www.inyocounty.us/covid-19/vaccine-information. It is through this portal that Inyo County and our vaccination partners can continue to prioritize getting the vaccine to people who are most at-risk, first. Again, if you have previously registered either through the Inyo County website or the Rural Health Clinic, there is no need to re-register. Residents without access to a computer can receive registration assistance by leaving their name and phone number on 760-873-3232 and a member of our team will return your call the following Tuesday or Thursday from 8 am to 12 noon. For those who have computer access and have vaccination related questions please email them to vaccine-info@inyocounty.us. Email is strongly preferred over phone and will be answered more quickly.
- COVID-19 Vaccine Update: Information and updates regarding vaccine roll out are posted to the Inyo County Vaccine Information webpage, https://www.inyocounty.us/covid-19/vaccine-information. Inyo County is currently receiving 300 1st dose vaccines per week and is dividing them between the groups of individuals who are currently eligible for the vaccine: Phase 1A medical workers; Phase 1B Tier 1 first responders, teachers and childcare workers, food and agriculture workers, and people aged 65 and over. We are advocating for more vaccine and expect to see our vaccine allocations grow over time as the state starts to receive more. Please make sure to register for your vaccine appointment at https://www.inyocounty.us/covid-19/vaccine-information and you will be contacted when an appointment is available.
