First 5 Inyo County proudly offers the following programs:

The sooner a delay or disability is caught; the sooner children can be connected with supports and services that make a real difference. The Ages & Stages Questionnaires are parent-completed developmental and social-emotional screenings to identify delays as early as possible. First 5 Inyo assists in coordinating screenings, connecting families with referral resources, and providing education around child development. Screenings can be picked up at 1360 N. Main St. Suite 203 or taken on your phone, tablet, or home computer at https://www.asqonline.com/family/e49e58

Inyo County Diaper Depot offers diapers and wipes to low income families residing in Inyo County. Caretakers may pick up a bundle of diapers and wipes once a month, per child. Diaper pick-ups are available at the Inyo County COB at 1360 N. Main St. Bishop, CA 93514. Lone Pine Office at 310 N. Jackson St. Lone Pine, CA 93545. Independence Fiscal Office at 155 E. Market St. Independence CA 93526.

The Inyo County Home Visiting program is available to English and Spanish speaking caretakers/children prenatally to 5 years old. Home Visits are personalized visits that include parent-child interactions, development-centered parent information and connections to resources surrounding family well-being. Referrals are encouraged from partnering providers.

Register your child and receive a free high quality book each month from Dolly Paton's Imagination Library. This program is at no cost to the child's family, and is available to all Inyo County children from birth until age 5. Countless parents have shared how excited their child is when their new book arrives each month. Take time to enjoy reading books with your child!

Improve and Maximize Programs so All Children Thrive is a program for early childhood education providers that care for children in family child care home, family friend and neighbor, and alternative care settings. First 5 Inyo partners with Inyo County Office of education to provide coaching and advising to providers to achieve high-quality learning environments.

Inyo County First5 provides free kits for new parents to Northern Inyo Hospital Labor and Delivery to send home with families at discharge. New Parent Kits contain many added items such as thermometer, infant tooth brush, toothpaste, teething toy, bib, and many other handouts and resources for new parents. If you did not receive one, call to pick one up.

The Reach Out and Read program gives young children the foundation for success by incorporating books into pediatric care, and encouraging families to read aloud together. First 5 Inyo partners with local clinics to provide a book at every well-child check. Ask your provider at your next visit about Reach Out and Read!

First 5 Commission

The Inyo County Children and Families Commission was created in 1999 by the Inyo County Board of Supervisors to carry out the work of Proposition 10 in the county. Its intent was to facilitate the creation, and implementation of an integrated, comprehensive, and collaborative system of information and services to enhance optimal early child development, and to ensure that children are ready to enter school and reach their full potential. The First 5 Inyo Commission generally meets on the fourth Thursday four times a year in August, October, January and April.



WHAT IS A DEVELOPMENTAL SCREENING?

Developmental screening provides a quick check of your child's motor, cognitive, language, and social-emotional skills. It helps determine if your child is meeting the appropriate milestones for their age.

Your answers will show your child's strengths, and will also be helpful in determining whether your child needs further support or assessment.


