STAFF COVID-19 EXPOSURE/ POSITIVE TEST

 Health Care Facilities are required to follow All Facilities Letters (AFLs), Cal/OSHA regulations, and CDC and CDPH COVID-19 guidelines for healthcare personnel.

RESIDENT COVID-19 EXPOSURE/ POSITIVE TEST

 SNFs should ensure residents identified with confirmed COVID-19 are isolated in a designated COVID-19 isolation area and will comply with mitigation strategies outlined in AFL 12-12 and CDC Infection Control recommendations.

MASKING

 SNFs are required to follow the Cal/OSHA Aerosol Transmissible Disease standard that requires the use of N95 respirators for worker protection during the care of suspect or confirmed COVID-19 cases.

OUTBREAK RESPONSE

- SNFs will report outbreaks (a disease incident of three or more cases in a week) to the Public Health Department.
- As workplaces, SNFs will adhere to Cal/OSHA COVID-19 prevention and notification regulations.

CalOSHA Requirements



REPORTING

 SNFs shall report hospitalization and/or death of a patient due to COVID-19 within one working day and will report weekly all positive COVID-19 patients to the CDC National Healthcare Safety Network (NHSN).
