2.	Public Comment	-	There was no public comment.
3.	Minutes	-	Stephanie presented the meeting minutes. Chrystina Pope motioned to approve the minutes. Anonda Nelson seconded the motion. Jeff Thomson abstained.

Innovative Partnership Agreement	-	Katelyne presented the Innovative Partnership Agreement 23- 24 for the council to review, delegating Anna Scott, HHS Director, to sign on behalf of Inyo County HHS. Christina Motioned to approve Anna to sign the Innovative Partnership Agreement. Jeff Thomson seconded. All were in favor.

- 8. Council Reports Anonda reported the Bishop Paiute Tribe has a shortage of Tribal RFA Homes, referrals can be sent to BPT Social Services Department.
 - Susanne reported the Foster Care commission meetings have resumed and she attended the first one.



9. Coordinator	 Chrystina requested Parenting Services/ co-parenting services offered in Inyo County be reviewed at the next Child Abuse Prevention Council meeting. Christina would like to see Kern Regional Center get involved, and look into more education for parents and caregivers other than Triple P. Jeff reported Probation is partnering with Inyo Council for the Arts to offer art classes in the schools. Probation staff are more present on the school campuses. Probation has a contract with Sacred Rock that offers outdoor services to youth, you can reach out to Penni Brown or Jeff for more information. AB505 recently passed creating new bureaucratic procedures and obstacles that counties must meet in order to receive the required funding to support vulnerable, high-risk youth. Stephanie reported that Inyo County Public Health and Prevention is applying for a California Dept of Parks and Rec grant with the East Side Student Center. Included in the grant are internship opportunities and leadership opportunities to mentor youth. One requirement of the grant funding is to offer outings to State Parks.




