#### 1. Call to Order & Roll Call

Chrystina Pope called the meeting to order at 12:05 PM.

Present were council members: Anonda Nelson, Griselda Ortiz, Holly DeVincent, Suzanne Rizo. Anna Scott

Not present were council members: Stephanie Tanksley, Jeff Thomson Also present were Katelyne Lent, First 5 Director, Micaela Muro, CAPC Coordinator, Brandi Taylor, Gina Ellis, Lisa Vetter, Maricela Baez, Kim Cash

#### 2. Public Comment

- As a member of the public, Chrystina spoke on community violence and seeing youth needing more support in schools with the infrastructure/post traumatic support like the gun threat happening on the previous Friday then Monday giving more support in the recovery than there was; Disaster preparedness/process important for safety and reestablishing after.
- Lisa suggested talking to PD and doing an assembly/what they are doing when these calls happen since it is so long (3 hours); things are done in threes, and they expect another by end of year.
- Kim recommended a review with parties at the site. Much changed after the last lock down. This one was more methodical. Fairgrounds has always been the national disaster center. Never had to move there but it was good practice. Good to do it with the older kids. Although intimidating with the gun pointing and hands up for them. Agreed to do techniques with the kids that are age appropriate; suggest fidget items for baskets or areas where they lock down to help in those situations with some kind of funding.
- Lisa agreed it went well/perhaps a parent site would be helpful.
- Suzanne asked what the school is doing and how maybe we can combine efforts.
- Public comment closed at 12:21.
- 3. Minutes
- Anna approved February 28th minutes, Susanne seconded, all were in favor.

#### 4. CAPM Activities

- Micaela and Katelyne reviewed the activities that took place throughout the month of April for Child Abuse prevention month including partnering with the following local coffee shops:

- -Vibras
- -3,000 stickers were put on their pastry bags and beverages every Friday of the month on April 5<sup>th</sup>, 12<sup>th</sup>, 19<sup>th</sup>, and 26<sup>th</sup> and stickers had to be re-ordered.
- -The community was encouraged to wear blue on Friday, April 5<sup>th</sup> via social media and the <u>Laughing Parrot Production broadcast</u>. HHS staff wore their blue HHS polos at All Staff Day and took pictures for Wear Blue Day.
- -Pinwheels were placed in offices and businesses at:
  - -Bishop Paiute Tribe OVCDC
  - -Office of Education Childcare Connections
  - -Northern Inyo Hospital Rural Health Clinic and Pediatrics
  - -Wild Iris
  - -Hing's Donuts
  - -Inyo County COB Bishop
  - -Inyo County COB Lone Pine
- -The Volunteer Resource Fair took place Friday, April 12<sup>th</sup> from 3PM-6PM at the City of Bishop Gazebo and brought in 31 adults and 37 youth for a total of 68 participants. Every participant received a reusable bag at the check-in with "100 ways to praise kids" on it for them to collect pins, pinwheels, coloring sheets, crayons, lanyards, and other great swag from tables.Community partners that participated included:

  - -Saint Vincent's Preventative Family Care
  - -Bishop Paiute Tribe RAVE program.

Live Scans were not utilized, however, the snow cones from Sierra Snow were a big hit!

- -Post-event survey to follow to be able to help planning for future CAPC event.
- -Check CAPC website to see statistics on the number of clicks during the month of April.
- -Gina reported on how the South County Public Health event had no turn out so re-visiting how to make it more well attended.
- Chrystina said Instagram helped bring many people last year or piggyback with fire department again.



- -The Resilience Symposium on April 22<sup>nd</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup> had good information received; advertisement on both days to have better turn out.
- -Gina and Kim said a list of the agencies there from Wild Iris would be helpful.
- -The memorial flag raising was on the morning of Friday, April 26<sup>th</sup> with Ambroshia Stone's honoring song.
- -Kim shared it's the first month of April that felt more involved than before.

#### 5. Parent Resources

- Contacting locations to see what is working/not working (surveying)/agencies to help support that education.
- Lisa talked about probation being a local provider to offer 52week program – Trees to Schools being used and can provide this with referral.
- CPS able to set this up.
- Chrystina said a gathering needs to take place.
- Susanne said Toiyabe had offered Triple P parenting and no longer is.
- Holly said they will use Motherhood and Fatherhood is Sacred to offer something culturally appropriate.
- Lisa can bring in penal code and Susanne looking at civil side
- Holly said CPS also has a WIC code they must follow.
- Sub-committee to meet and discuss further options.
- Have needed parties with codes at sub-committee and Micaela will send out meeting times.

#### 6. Council Reports

- Judge Susanne took training online speaking to new legislative bill requiring independence cases for minor's attorney to meet with child. Bill asks when you meet with minor that are represented with attorney. Extending re-unification. Less removal and now reports have to say impact of removal. Will follow up with Holly for Brown Bag.
- Holly went over how Santa Clara doesn't do removals/decriminalizing domestic violence and what that will looks like and how CPS is changing PC code with emotional/physical/poverty/homeless not being used against parents. Hasn't changed yet. Massive movement in LA to remove general neglect.
- Report from brown bag with Susanne and Holly.
- Chrystina followed on how the public knows law enforcement will feel the impact.
- Mari chimed in that perhaps training/information out to the community.
- Kim asked about mobile housing and implementation in July/Oregon has good mental health crisis unit.



- Possibly utilizing the ongoing court announcements with some information on their big screen.
- Anna went over the foster care rate development and how it will look as an independent advising state agency to look over foster care rates. Increases funding and more support.
   Financial plan attached to child. Concern over 15000/month and what that will look like with reunification and what is lost with that. Shifting their plan due to being in club sport then not used as an example.
- Anonda shared the ICWA program will be doing another series of trainings for Qualified Expert Witness's, they are trying to recruit another wave of QEW's. Anonda also shared they will be looking into training individuals in reporting to hotlines (mandated training). Re-affirming to reporters.
- The Bishop Paiute Tribe has opioid funding to be able to offer services and have a kick-starter event next month at the Bishop Paiute Palace Casino.

- Mandated reporters to community supporters (raising stakes for CPS intervention) and connect community to more services. OCAP state training is coming out for this.
- Incentives being a big part of attendance to community offerings.
- Lisa will talk to chief Durr about combining school safety efforts with coping support to families.
