## Road Status- 05/18/2026

1. Horseshoe Meadows Rd. – **OPEN**
2. Furnace Creek Rd.- **OPEN** (Tecopa Area)  
From Old Spanish Tail Rd. to Tecopa Hot Springs Rd.
3. White Mountain Rd.-**OPEN**. The road is clear of snow to the dirt. Please be cautious of icy patches in the shaded areas.
4. Upper Rock Creek Rd **OPEN**. (Closed at the top, due to snow between Mosquito Flat and the pack station)
5. North Lake Rd. – **OPEN**. Open to the Day Use Parking Lot.
6. Hwy 168 and Lake Sabrina Rd above Aspendell – **OPEN**. The road is open all the way to Lake Sabrina.
7. South Lake Rd. – **OPEN** - The road is open all the way to the lake.
8. Upper Whitney Portal Rd. - **OPEN**



## Storm Related Closure



9. Hunter Mountain Rd.- **CLOSED** (Saline Valley Area)  
Closed because significant mud accumulation has made it impassable for vehicles to drive on this road.
10. Old Toll Rd – **CLOSED** (Panamint Springs)  
It is closed from HWY 190 to Ophir Rd due to flooding from storm Hilary. The road is completely gone in many areas. **No anticipated opening date currently.**
11. Wildrose Rd – **CLOSED** (Death Valley National Park)  
Washed out, impassable with a 9-foot-deep cut; closed from Trona Wildrose Rd into Rattlesnake Gulch. **No anticipated opening date currently.**
12. Cottonwood Rd.- **CLOSED**  
Closed from the intersection Cottonwood Powerhouse Rd. (just west of HWY 395) to the end of the road. Three different culverts, that carry Cottonwood Creek beneath the road were washed away during Storm Hilary. Flash flooding caused extensive damage, and the dirt road was washed out in multiple areas. **No anticipated opening date currently.**

## Additional Notes

- Storm **Hilary** caused long-term damage to Cottonwood Rd., Wildrose Rd and Old Toll Rd. These roads currently have no estimated reopen dates.

- Winter **closures** (Hwy 168, North Lake, South Lake, Horseshoe Meadows, Whitney Portal, Onion Valley) are routine and expected to reopen in spring.

- If traveling in **Death Valley National Park**, conditions can change quickly, please check the DVNP website for the latest updates.
