7. BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES ACT (BHSA) (PUBLIC HEARING)

Public Comment on Behavioral Health Integrated Plan, Deputy Director to discuss State requested changes, BHAB to approve the Behavioral Health Integrated Plan, approve and authorize Anna Scott, BH Director, to make non-substantive revisions, if further revisions are requested by Department of Healthcare Services (DHCS)

The Public Hearing commences at 2:45 pm. Melissa Best-Baker reported on the public comment she received from the Managed Care Plans. DHCS has added 3 CARE Court questions. Revisions requested (due tomorrow) pertain to County performance workbook and how we will address disparities in data. Lori Bengochia explained the revisions requested are minimal, in comparison to other counties. Mrs. Best-Baker is working on the budget with the fiscal team.

Mrs. Best-Baker asked for comments on the plan and for approval of the plan that includes the DHCS revisions. Ms. Saenz acknowledged the complexity of the Plan. Mrs. Best-Baker explained that the expenses and revenue sections will be reflected in the final plan. A lively discussion ensued.

BHAB meeting members and attendees asked questions, especially about housing and budget sections. Mrs. Best-Baker shared information about staffing to increase outreach, housing, and continuing to fund the Family Strengthening Team. Supervisor Wadelton asked about CARE Act (Community Assistance, Recovery, and Empowerment Act). Mrs. Best-Baker explained it as an in-depth wraparound set of services and case management. Mrs. Bengochia added that it is whole person care, wrapping around the client to keep the person whole, healthy and housed.

BHAB meeting members asked what assertive field-based SUD outreach entails. Mrs. Best-Baker shared some of the outreach SUD staff currently does at the schools and at the Wellness Center. She will be joining the Center of Excellence (COE) to learn more.

Public Hearing closed at 3:15 pm.

Mr. Peters moved to approve the Behavioral Health Integrated Plan, approve and authorize Anna Scott, BH Director, to make non-substantive revisions, if further revisions are requested by DHCS. Ms. Saenz seconded the motion. Motion carried: Ms. Saenz – Aye, Mr. Peters – Aye, Supervisor Wadellton - Aye. None opposed

Mrs. Best-Baker shared the Data Report Power Point (please see attached). Mrs. Bengochia told the group about Consumer Perception Surveys that would be taking place next week with clients who come in for services. This required survey helps us with quality improvement – It shows us where we are and whether we are meeting consumer needs.

The next regularly scheduled BHAB meeting will be moved to June 24, 2026.

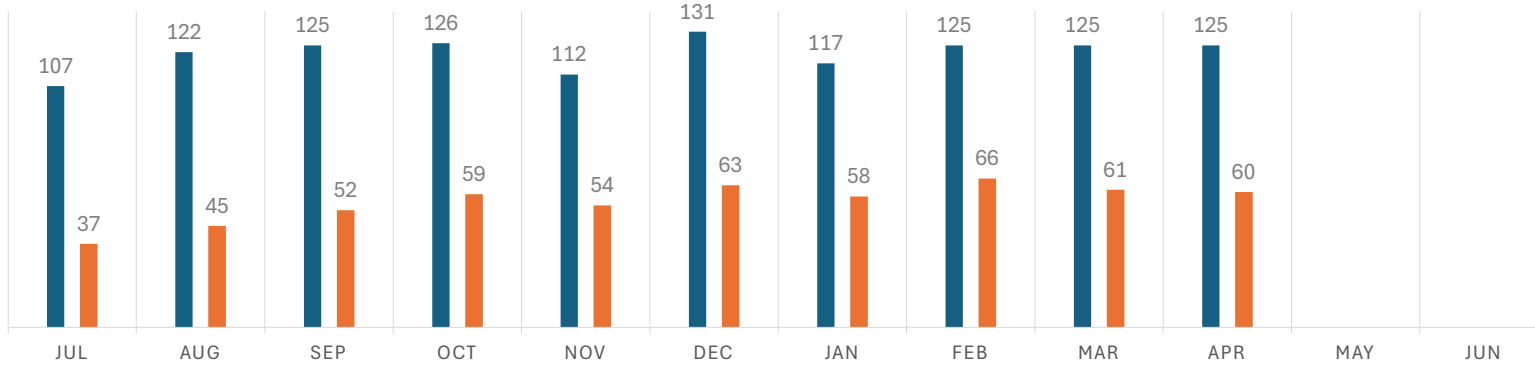

Behavioral Health FY 25-26 At-A-Glance

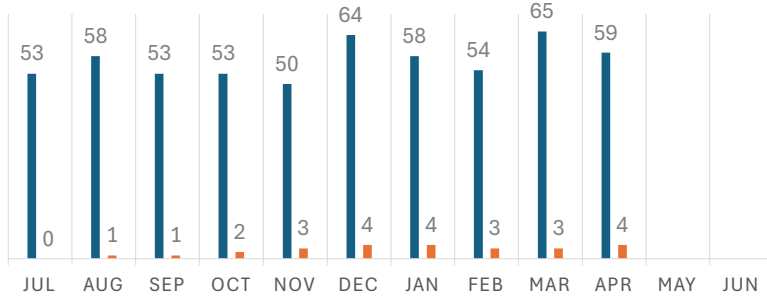

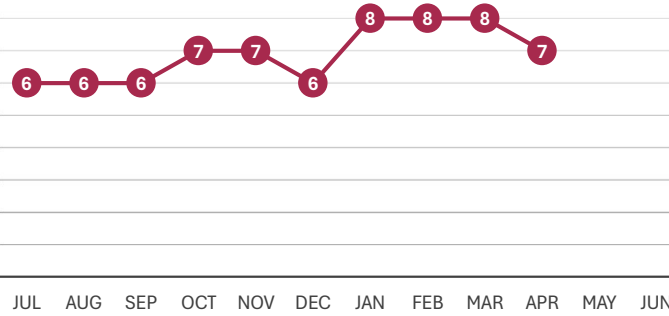


Med Management Clients

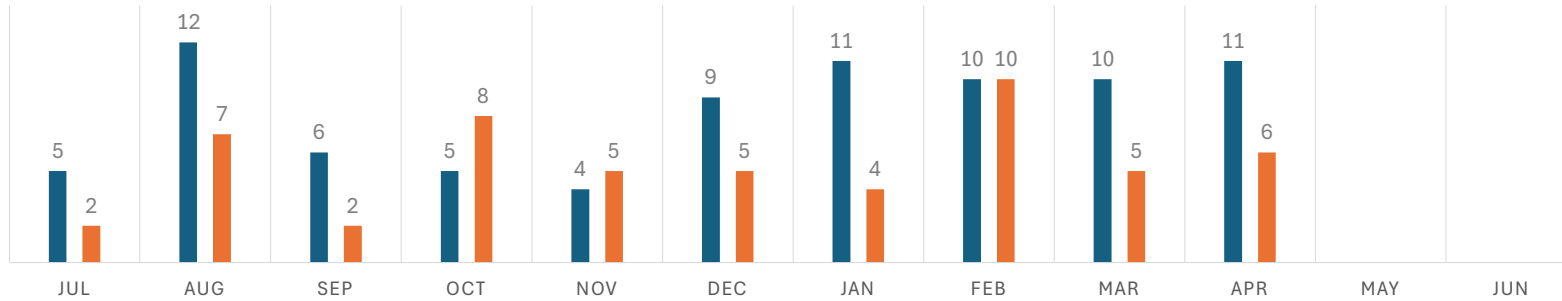

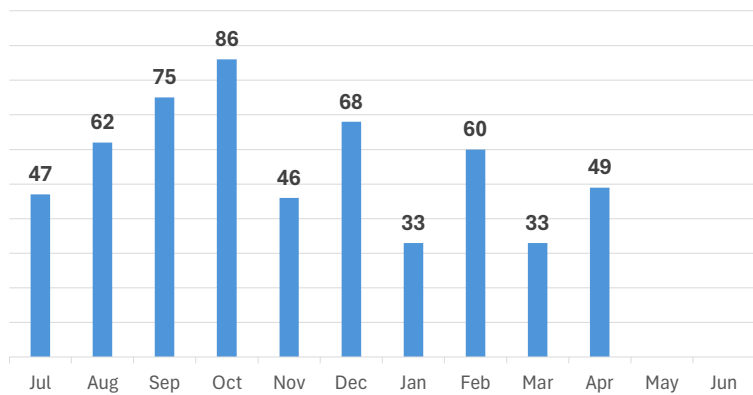
Behavioral Health FY 25-26 At-A-Glance

New Mental Health Referred Clients

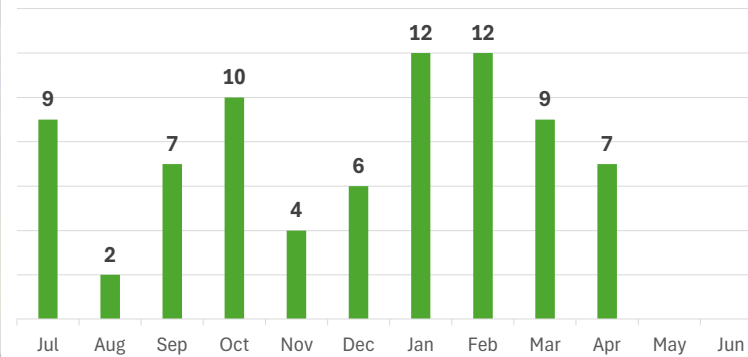

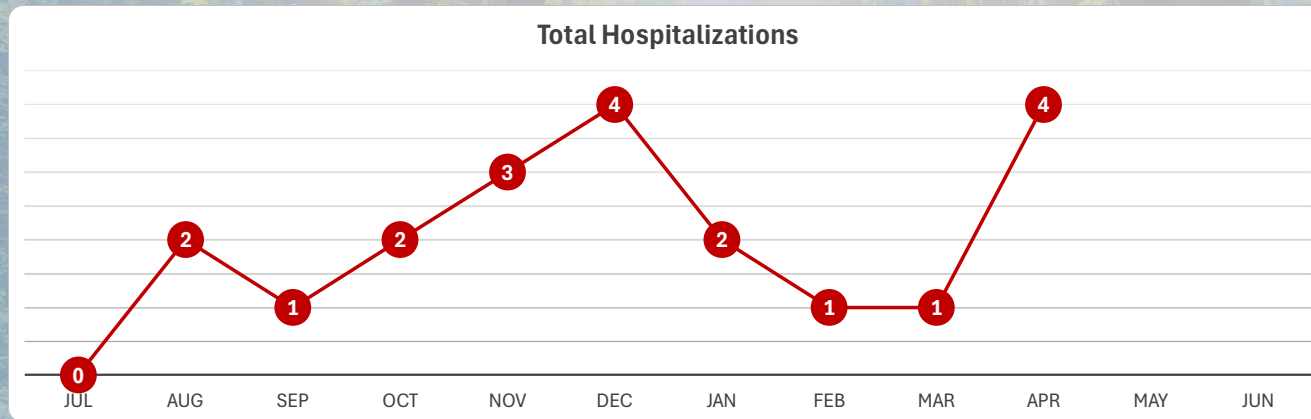
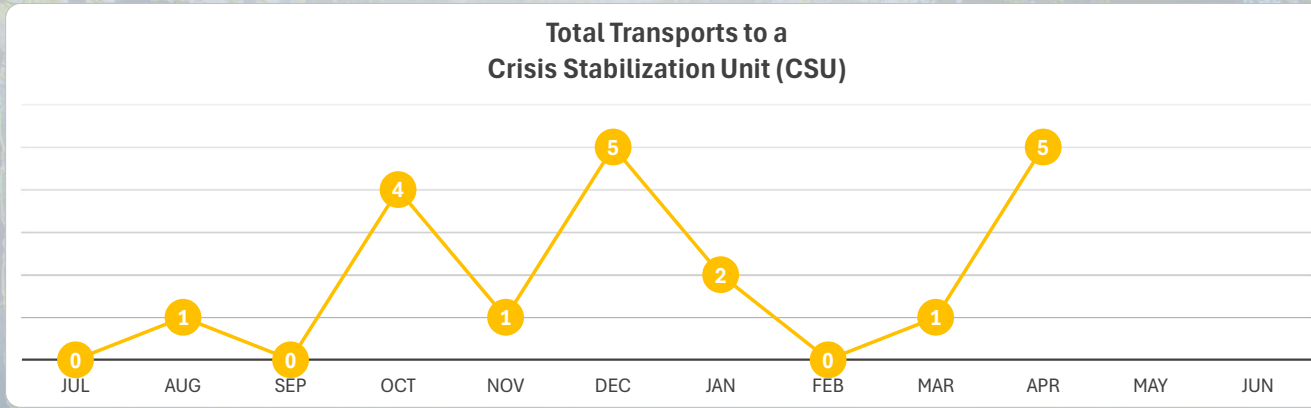
Total Mental Health Assessments



Total Child and Adolescent Needs and Strengths (CANS)

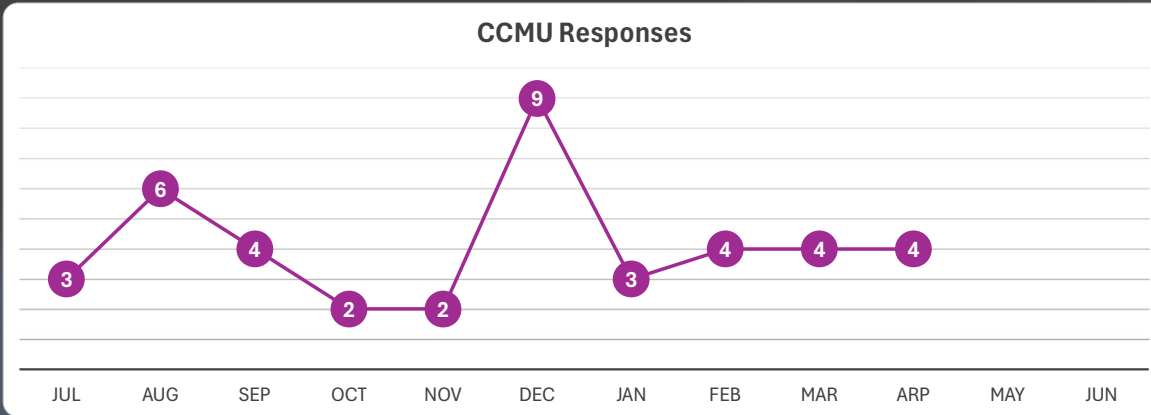

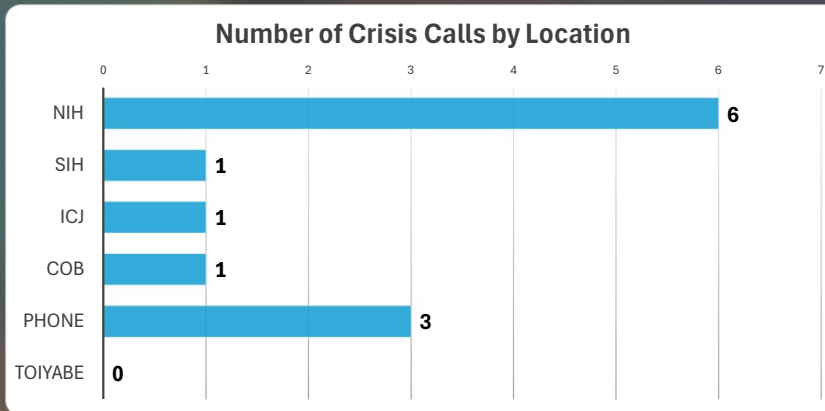


Crisis Care Mobile Unit (CCMU) & Crisis Calls

Number of Crisis Calls by Location

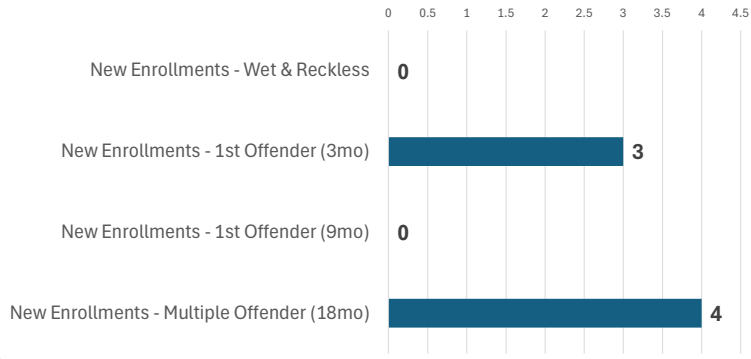

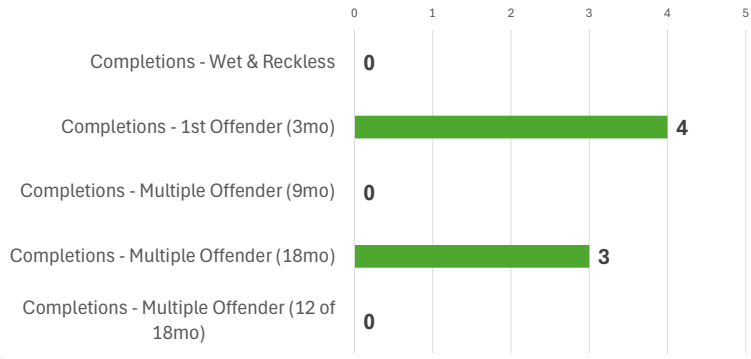

DUI New Enrollments



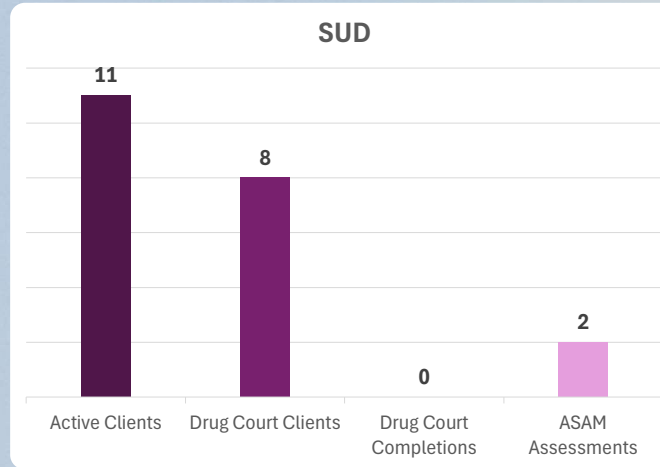

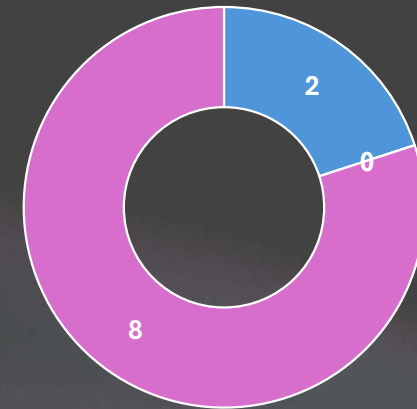


LPS Conservatorship & Care Court

Clients placed in a licensed residential or treatment facility located within the county.

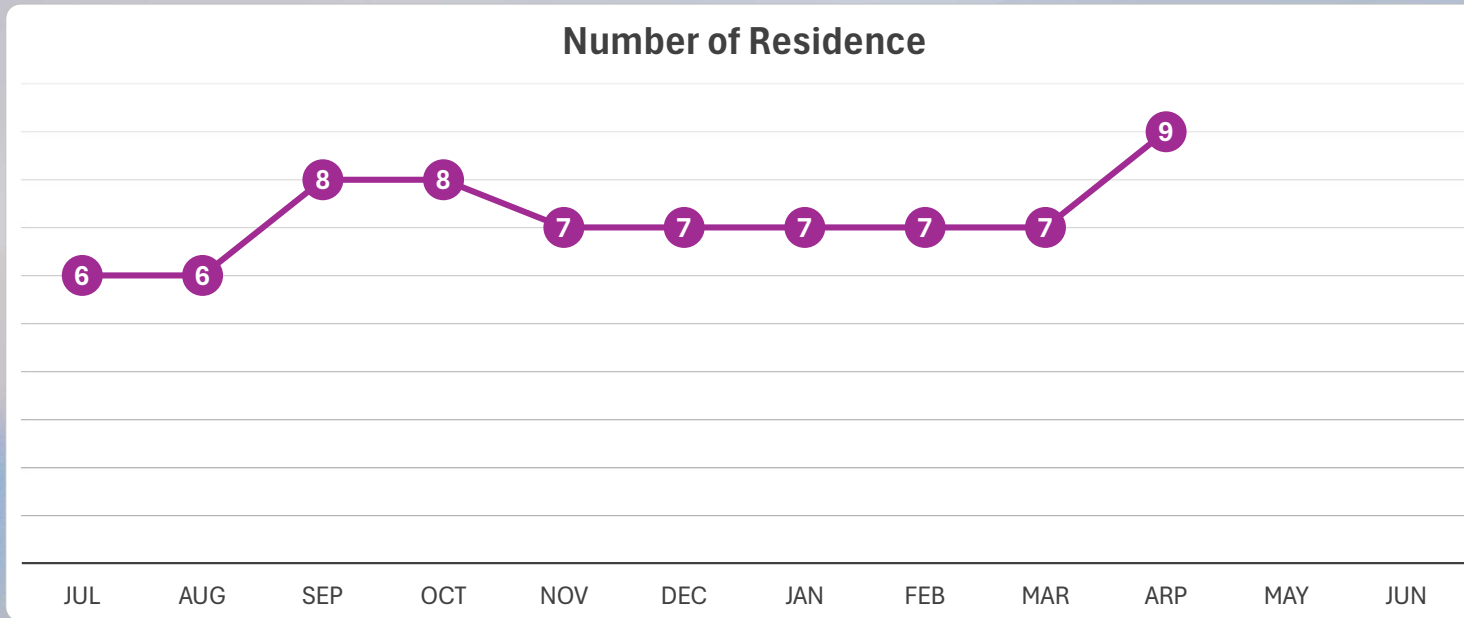
In-County Home:

Clients residing in a private home setting within the county, receiving services and support in the community.

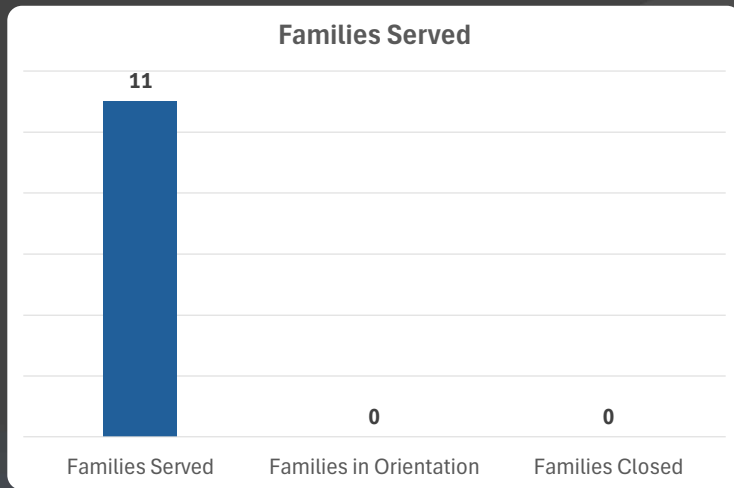
Out-of-County Facility:

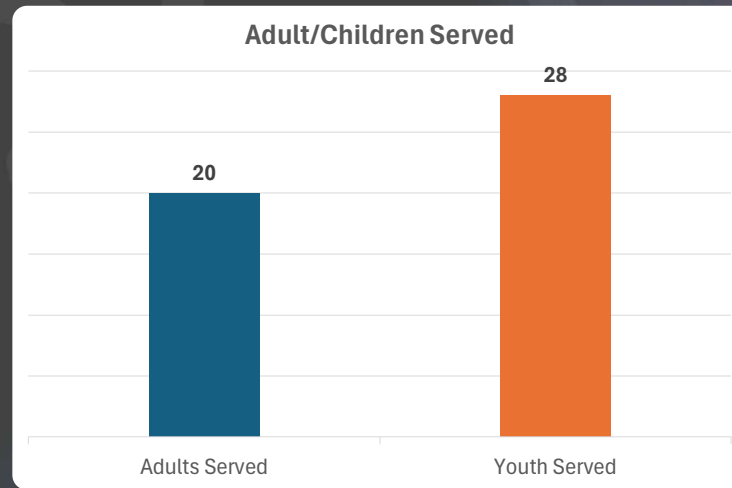

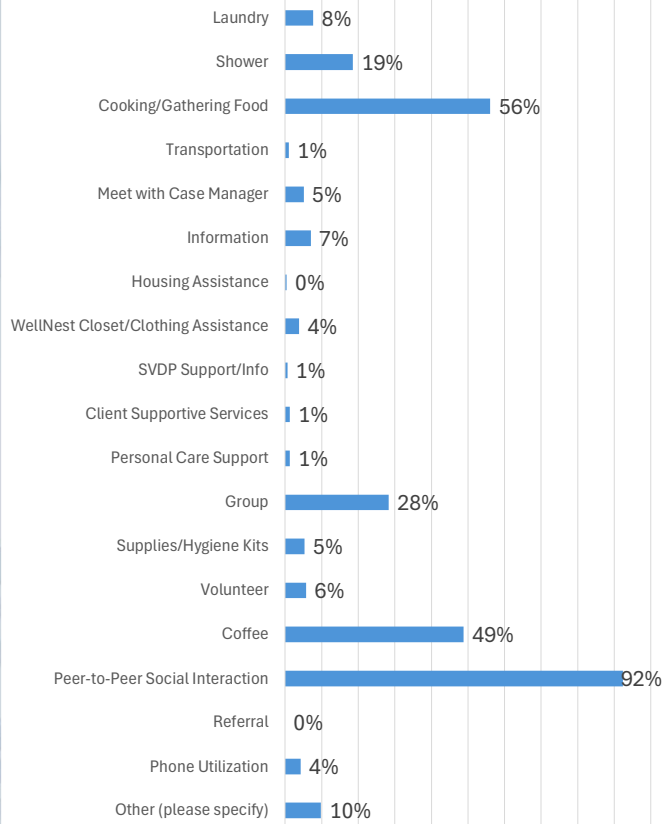

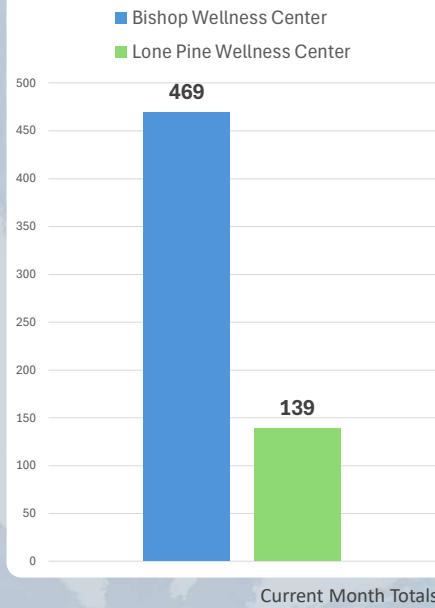

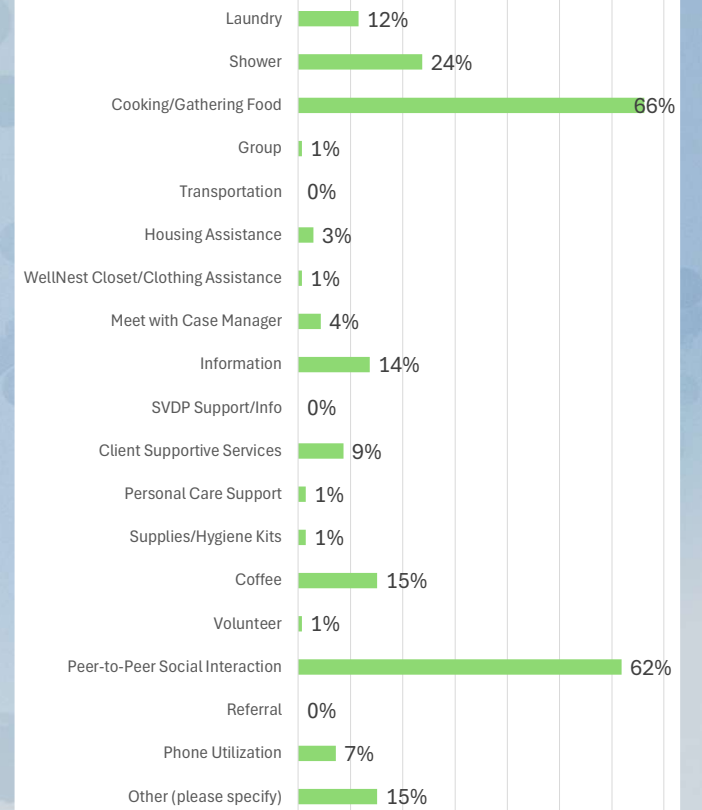
Bishop Wellness Center - Reason

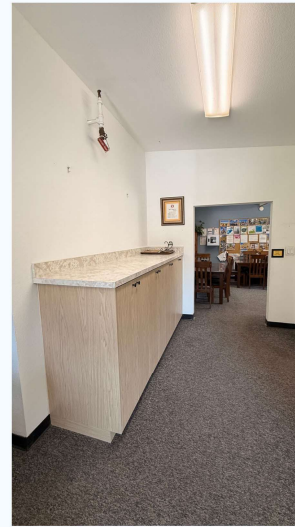

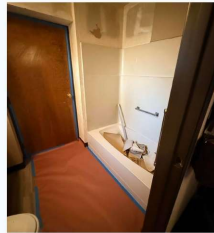
